

#### 1) Name the Parts of the Guitar



#### Three Main Sections:

- A) The \_\_\_\_\_ is hollow, allowing the sound to be amplified!
- B) The \_\_\_\_\_ has frets that allow me to shorten the strings, and change the tones!
- C) The \_\_\_\_\_ has tuners attached so I can adjust the tightness of my strings, which changes the pitch!

#### Smaller parts:

- 1) The \_\_\_\_\_ attaches the strings to the "body"
- 2) The \_\_\_\_\_ keeps the strings in position.
- 3) The \_\_\_\_\_ amplifies the sound of my guitar.
- 4) The \_\_\_\_\_ is the main playing area, where my fingers move very fast!
- 5) The metal \_\_\_\_\_ are used to create notes, by shortening the strings.
- 6) The \_\_\_\_\_ also keeps the strings in position, much like the saddle!
- 7) The \_\_\_\_\_ are used to tighten and loosen the strings, to change pitches.
