ANNOUNCER

Rusty Quill Presents: The Pit Below Paradise. Episode Five – Will and Want.

[MUSIC]

SCENE 1

MONTAGE - A DREAM-LIKE SPAN, EACH RUTH LINE BROKEN BY A VARYING AMOUNT OF TIME.

RUTH

So... When are we going back?

RUTH

No, really, Dorian, can we visit again soon?

RUTH

Dori, it's been three weeks. Come on, it would be weird for me to go without you. Where's the person who's all gungho family?

DORIAN

Ruth, there's something we have to tell you.

RUTH

(NEUTRAL)

Really! Yeah, no, I assumed you two would at some point. Congratulations.

WILL

Thanks, um... It's still new. And secret, obviously.

RUTH

Obviously... Considering you waited this long to tell me.

RUTH

Yeah, I'd love to, but there's this meditation thing Dori's church is doing out in Young City, so I'm gonna be gone for the night.

I'm going to go meet them since Dori doesn't want to go home. I bet you two will be happy to get some alone time, though!

RUTH

Of course I didn't tell them anything! No one even asked, god, you two are getting so cagey.

(RUTH EXITS THE SCENE. WE SETTLE,
MORE CONCRETELY, INTO WILL AND
DORIAN ALONE IN THEIR DORM, CURLED
UP AND LISTENING TO THE RADIO.

WILL

Are you thinking about it at all?

DORIAN

(INNOCENTLY) Thinking about what?

WILL

She really wants to go back.

DORIAN

But you hate it there.

WILL

I don't *hate* it.

DORIAN

But you would rather not go, and I'd rather not go without you.

WILL

Why should my feelings matter more than hers?

DORIAN

They don't...I just don't want you to be uncomfortable is all. Come on, the commercial's almost over.

ANNOUNCER (RADIO)

And now, back to: Wendy Serenity, Monster Killer!

WILL

She's not going to stop asking.

SCENE 2

(INT. - DINING HALL, RUTH AND WILL EATING TOGETHER.)

WILL

Sorry you haven't been able to go back yet.

RUTH

Has Dorian mentioned *anything?* I thought his family was super clingy. I figured he'd be going back in no time.

WILL

(HESITATES)

I think they fought. That's the one thing he doesn't really talk about.

RUTH

But that's what spurred him to...

(INTO HER DRINK)

You know, say he likes you?

WILL

(DEEPLY UNCOMFORTABLE)

Maybe? Like I said, it's all still new, so we don't know exactly where we...

RUTH

But it hasn't been *no* time. You two must have talked about it a little —— n-not that it's any of my business!

WILL

We've talked.

(BEAT.)

RUTH

...Are you sure about that?

WILL

I'm sure we both have our own secrets —— and a right to them.

Well, has he talked about <i>i</i>	RUTH me? I mean——! Me and the village.
Like what?	WILL
•	RUTH Id be a good fit. If I can just get over Paulette could help me talk to Ned… nousing and work.
Wait, what?	WILL
Oh, come on, is it that biza	RUTH arre?
You're in school!	WILL
Only because I have nowh I wouldn't bother!	RUTH ere else to go! If I had somewhere else,
Ruth, you've lived there fo	WILL or one weekend.
Yeah, and I was happy even happened before. Do you	RUTH ery single second of it. That's <i>never</i> know what that feels like?
l'm skeptical, but——	WILL
——You hate that place.	RUTH
No. No, I don't.	WILL

(SIGHS.)

I would never want to live there, but if it makes you both happy...
then I can get used to it. And I'll get through to Dori.

RUTH

(VERY WARMLY) Really? Thank you, Will.

SCENE 3

(INT. - THE DORM ROOM, WILL RETURNING WITH HIS HANDS FULL WHILE DORIAN CALLS HOME ON HIS RADIO.)

DORIAN

I know.

PAULETTE (RECEIVER)

Your ceremony is four weeks away, honey. You need to check in.

DORIAN

I know —— Oh, Mama, my roommate just walked in. I gotta let you go. Talk soon. Love you.

SOUND: HE HANGS UP.

DORIAN (CONT'D) (FLIRTATIOUSLY)

Hey, roommate.

WILL

Did she say "ceremony?"

DORIAN

Yeah. It's a... village thing. Anyway, i-it's not important. What are those?

WILL

Fruit custards from the dining hall. Wanna sit outside?

SCENE 4

(EXT. - FLOWER GARDEN, AFTERNOON. DORI AND WILL LOUNGING AROUND IN THE GRASS.)

DORI

This is different than what I thought it would be.

WILL

What?

DORI

You know. Me and you.

WILL

Yeah. But it's... nice, right? I like spending time with you.

DORI

Yeah! And you know I like you.

(BEAT.)

Oh, I memorized you a poem!

WILL

Really?

DORI

Yeah. From the library. Okay, how does it start... Ahem: "O, that yourself were——!"

No, hold on. Um...Ahem:

"Oh, that you were yourself! But you are, love, No longer... Um. Against this coming end you should prepare...

(BEAT.)

"Who lets so bare a house fall to decay!"

Right? Because you're studying architecture? Maybe I need to read it again. Sorry. It was gonna be a good surprise, too.

WILL

(SMILING)

No, it was sweet. Do you like Shakespeare?

DORI

He was the most famous name I could think of...

SOUND: DORI TAKES AN AWKWARD BITE OF CUSTARD; CHOKES ON IT. IT'S A WHOLE EVENT.

WILL

Dori?

DORI

(COUGHING) Fine, I'm fine...

(GETTING CONTROL)

Ugh, good thing Ruth didn't see that. She'd never let me live that down. "Can't even eat custard and walk at the same time!"

WILL

How do you know I'll let you live it down?

DORI

Because you're Will. You're the sweet one.

WILL

I'm sweet? I thought you were the sweet one. I don't talk enough to be "sweet."

DORI

No! You're the sweet one, Ruth's the funny exciting one, and I'm the charming one.

WILL

(DISBELIEVING LAUGH)

Charming?

DORI

Yeah! I charmed you, didn't I? Besides, a relationship where the two people are just sweet wouldn't work, would it? Someone has to keep it interesting.

(BEAT.)

She really does keep coming up, huh.

WILL

That's natural. We're all friends who spend a lot of time together. Speaking of——

DORI

——No, I know, I know. And it's nice to be alone, obviously, but... I'm starting to feel like the balance is off. Someone's always getting excluded now.

WILL

If you and I are together, Ruth is left out. If you and Ruth are together, I'm...

DORI

Crabby.

WILL

I am not crabby.

DORI

It's justified! You should be crabby! I'm still crabby, after how they treated you.

WILL

But Ruth had a really good time there. And you care about Ruth.

DORI

You know, when you and her hang out, things don't feel out of balance. You two make sense.

WILL

We've known each other a long time. Ruth and I fight if we spend too long on our own. Things do go out of balance.

DORI

"Balance" is starting to not even feel like a word anymore. Baaaalance.

WILL

The point *I'm* trying to make is, even if we're all friends who owe each other certain respects, we're also all adults who can handle our own emotions. I know it's not personal if you and Ruth want to go to the village together.

DORI

But what about you?

WILL		
What about me? I just told you.		
DORI But——		
WILL ——Dori.		
(SIGHS.) You're using me as an excuse. At some point, you maybe need to consider why <i>you're</i> stalling going home.		
DORI I'm not stalling. I love home. What kind of a girl——		
WILL ——doesn't like his home. Yeah. Fine. If I'm the only thing stopping you, then I'll come, too.		
DORI After what happened with the meditation?!		
WILL I can make my own decisions, Dori. Besides, if this place is going to be special to you two, it's not like I can ignore it.		
SOUND: WILL PULLS OUT HIS RADIO.		
WILL (CONT'D) So? Does that solve your problem?		
DORI I I guess so. Technically.		
WILL Great.		
SOUND: WILL DIALS OUT A CALL.		
DORI What are you doing?		
(SMALL BEAT.)		

RUTH

Hello?

WILL

(INTO RADIO)

Hey, Ruth? I'm gonna hand you to Dori. You two pick a date.

SCENE 5

(INT. - RUTH'S CAR, MORNING. RUTH, WILL, AND DORIAN TRAVEL UP THE LONG DIRT ROAD TO PARADISE VILLAGE, SURROUNDED BY TREES.)

DORIAN

So Will and I do not look at each other.

WILL

We can't not look at each other. That would be weird.

DORIAN

Fine. We are allowed to look at each other a medium amount, only when it feels normal. And we don't go off anywhere alone.

RUTH

And I go anywhere and everywhere, you help me make sure that happens, and I look at anyone I want.

(BEAT.)

What the... who is that?

DORIAN

Did you take the right turn?

RUTH

Of course I did. There's only one road!

DORIAN

Uh, then, I don't understand.

SOUND: THE CAR SLOWS. RUTH

ROLLS

DOWN HER WINDOW. OUTSIDE THE

VEHICLE, A FENCE GUARD APPROACHES.

FENCE GUARD

Can I help y—— Oh. Dorian. Who are these two?

DORIAN

Yeah, hi, what's going on here? There was never a fence on this road before! And why do you have a weapon?

SOUND: THE GUARD HEFTS A RIFLE.

FENCE GUARD

Oh, this? No cause for concern. Just in case a bear wanders too close. Protection while I'm on duty.

DORIAN

But why are you on duty?

FENCE GUARD

Village felt the need for an increase in security. We've had some issues with outsiders coming and going.

RUTH

How? This place is all canvas and basil.

FENCE GUARD (CHUCKLES)

There's a little more to us than that. Simply can't be too careful. No one'll stop Dorian from coming in, of course, or you two if you're with him I suppose, but y'all will need Ned's permission to leave. That's become standard for anyone.

RUTH

Even just to, like, run out and pick up supplies?

FENCE GUARD

'Fraid so.

WILL

(LOWLY)

Are we... sure we still want to do this?

(BEAT.)

RUTH

Of course. It's common sense for a place with a lot of food to be security-conscious. Right, Dori?

DORIAN

Yeah... It makes sense to me.

FENCE GUARD

Then I'll get this gate open for ya. Welcome home, Dori.

SOUND: HE STRIDES OFF, PATS THE HOOD OF THE CAR. A GATE OPENS.

RUTH

He slapped my car...

SOUND: THEY DRIVE ON.

SCENE 6

(INT. - RUTH'S CAR, MORNING, AS THEY CRUISE THROUGH THE VILLAGE PROPER.)

DORIAN

Well, at least the village is the same on the inside.

(SIGHS)

Home again. No, this is good. I can do this.

SOUND: WILL REACHES FOR DORIAN'S HAND.

WILL

Hey. You love it here.

DORIAN

Careful!

SOUND: DORI SNATCHES HER HAND BACK.

DORIAN (CONT'D)

You're already breaking rule one!

WILL

Sorry! I didn't —— I was trying to comfort you.

DORIAN

Well, don't. Someone could see.

(TENSE BEAT.)

RUTH

Dori, now's kind of your last chance to get anything off your chest. You sure you're feeling okay?

DORIAN

I... No. I'm not.

PAULETTE (OFF)

Kids!

WILL

(SOFTLY)

Damn.

SOUND: RUTH ROLLS HER WINDOW DOWN. PAULETTE DRAWS UP BESIDE THE CAR, HOLDING A BASKET OF

CLOTH.

PAULETTE

You made it! It's so good to see you again. Hi, Ruth. Will.

RUTH WILL

Hi, Paulette. Hi.

DORIAN

Hi, Mama. Didn't expect to run into you before we got to the house.

SOUND: PAULETTE HEFTS HER BASKET.

PAULETTE

I've been out and about since sun-up. Lily's birthday is next week, so I thought she might like a new dress. Something real nice for special occasions. But sweetie, did I hear you right? Did you say you were driving up to the house?

DORIAN

Uh yea, where else would we go?

PAULETT

E I thought Ned called you.

DORIAN

Ned?

PAULETTE

Yes. He's arranging a couple rooms for you and your friends, to host you.

WILL

What?

RUTH

Yeah, wait, the *leader*?

DORIAN

(TERSE)

What brought on this... change of plans?

PAULETTE

Your college education, of course! With the things you're learning at school, it only makes sense for Ned to use you to help the village. He wants to get to know you better, and your friends, of course. He wants to start job training right away ——sorry, kids, but that does mean Dori may get pulled away from time to time!

RUTH

Hey, that's exciting! Now, if only it can be that easy for me.

DORIAN

So, wait. I'm really not staying at home?

PAULETTE

Well, you're not a kid anymore, baby. But you're all invited for lunch tomorrow. I'll see you then, okay?

DORIAN

...Okay.

SOUND: PAULETTE TURNS AWAY. RUTH RESUMES DRIVING.

WILL

Why wouldn't someone call to tell us all this? (SMALL, UNSURE BEAT.)

You know, it's not too late to turn around.

RUTH

Actually, according to that gate guy, it kind of is.

DORIAN (DEVASTATED)

No, no, it's fine. Let's go to Ned's. I'm sure it will be just as comforting as the house I grew up in, where all my things are, and where my family is...

SCENE 7

(INT. - NED'S HOUSE, MORNING. DORI, RUTH, AND WILL LET THEMSELVES INTO A HUGE FOYER WHERE MAXINE RUMMAGES IN A DESK.)

DORIAN

Maxine! Long time no see.

SOUND: SHE STOPS, SLIGHTLY HARRIED.

MAXINE

Dorian! Ruth, Will.

WILL

Have we met?

MAXINE

You'll have to forgive me, I just walked in the door myself. Please feel free to hang up your coats and set your things down. We'll have them brought to your rooms.

SOUND: THEY SHED THEIR COATS, BAGS.

DORIAN

How did everyone know we were coming here except us?

MAXINE

That's my fault. It was my responsibility to radio this morning when the decision was made, but something came up. I'm afraid I've been running around most of the day.

Mr. Ziliak is in his private study. I'll take you to him.

SOUND: THEY FOLLOW MAXINE DEEPER INTO THE HOUSE.

RUTH

How is this place even bigger on the inside?

WILL

Why is it so flashy? I thought you said your services were all outside. Why do you need all the...?

DORIAN

Scriptures on the walls? I think someone just... Gifted them to Ned. Wouldn't it be unkind not to hang them? We've got tons of talented people who want to show our leader their appreciation. What's wrong with that?

WILL

Hmm.

SOUND: MAXINE KNOCKS ON A DOOR.

NED (WITHIN)

Yes?

MAXINE

Your guests have arrived, Ned.

SOUND: NED COMES OUT TO GREET THEM.

NED

Wonderful! Right on schedule. I'll take them from here. Are their rooms ready?

MAXINE

Yes, sir.

NED

Marvelous. And I trust all went well this morning?

MAXINE

Straightforward, sir. I'll go handle the wrap-up.

NED

Actually, keep Evelyn on that. But get yourself ready to go.

SOUND: MAXINE DEPARTS.

NED (CONT'D)

Ruth. Good to see you again. You look vibrant.

RUTH

Excited to be back. Thank you for hosting us.

NED

Nonsense. You're practically family already. Allow me to show you where you'll be staying.

SOUND: HE LEADS THEM DOWN THE HALL.

NED (CONT'D)

Now Dorian, Ruth, you'll be across the hall from each other here. Will, you're a little ways downward yet, at the end there on the right. Everyone, go on. Take a peek.

SOUND: WILL HEADS DOWN THE HALL. BEHIND HIM, WE HEAR DORIAN AND RUTH ENTERING THEIR ROOMS.

DORIAN

Three rooms... We wouldn't have had that in the ranch house.

RUTH

Oh my God. This is beautiful!

NED

You can see the whole village through that window.

DORIAN

Thank you, Ned. It's lovely.

SOUND: WILL OPENS HIS DOOR. HE HUFFS A SOUR LAUGH.

WILL (NARRATING)

It was beautiful! An unmade twin bed with a stack of white sheets folded over top. My bag sideways on the room's only end table. Through the scraggly pine branches scratching nearflush against the window, I could *almost* see... more trees.

RUTH

Can I light these candles?

NED

Of course! There should be some matches in the desk.

RUTH

Awesome, how's yours, Dori?

SOUND: SHE CROSSES TO DORI'S ROOM AS WILL RE-ENTERS THE HALLWAY.

RUTH (CONT'D)

Look at your closet space! Sure we don't want to stay a week?

NED

(QUIETLY)

Everything up to your standards?

WILL

I'd say it was exactly what I expected.

SOUND: NED CHUCKLES.

WILL (CONT'D)

Mr.	Ziliak,	I don't	intend t	to make	myself a	at home	in your	village.
ľm	here for	or them	n. That's	all.				

NED

I understand, let's say I arranged a car for your transportation home...

WILL

If they'd ——

DORIAN

Will! Can we see your room?

NED

I was thinking Ruth might like a tour of the town's major facilities. The stables, the library, some gathering spots. That way, you and I could have a little private sit-down.

DORIAN

What about——

WILL

——I'll be fine, Dori.

RUTH

Couldn't Will come with me?

NED

Of course. If he wants to. I simply understood that William likes to keep to himself.

WILL

It's Will. I'll stay. If you two don't have fun, I swear-

SOUND: DORI AND RUTH CHUCKLE.

WILL (CONT'D)

(SMILING)

Just enjoy yourselves.

RUTH

Thanks for coming, Will.

WILL

Go on. Tell me all about it later.

NED

You should find Maxine down in the foyer. She's an excellent guide. Have her show you anything you'd like.

RUTH

Quite the welcome you hand out around here.

SOUND: SHE GOES OFF.

WILL

Alright. I'll see you later, Dorian.

SCENE 8

(INT. - WILL'S ROOM, AFTERNOON. WILL READS IN BED WHEN HIS RADIO RINGS.)

SOUND: HE ANSWERS.

WILL

Hello?

RUTH (RECEIVER)

Hey! I wanted to check in. Also, I just got shown around the library, and it's so cute!

WILL

That's great.

RUTH (RECEIVER)

Want me to borrow anything for you? They've got poets who were actually alive in this century.

WILL

I'm alright. Seen anything cool? (BEAT.) Ruth?

RUTH

(RECEIVER) I may have gone on a house tour.

WILL

What? Really?

RUTH (RECEIVER)

Yeah. It's not definitive, obviously, and everyone's being kind of sly, but... yeah. I really think I need to go for it.

(BEAT.)

WILL

When you get the chance to run, you take it.

(ANOTHER.)

RUTH (RECEIVER)

You know, I really am so happy for... (VOICE LOWERS)

You and Dorian. You're going to make each other so —— actually, uh, Maxine's got the car. Gotta go.

WILL

Ruth——!

SOUND: THE CALL CUTS OUT.

WILL (NARRATING)

Just when I'd managed to forget the anxieties dangling over me, Ruth kindly gave me a reminder. I'd spent the better part of two hours trying to calm myself with familiar books, jumping nervously between them —— and for some reason, I was still here. I'd done my job, gotten my friends out of their rut. The only goal now was to slip off on my own before either of them had a chance to argue.

I couldn't have been a high priority for Ned Ziliak, but still, he'd seemed happy enough at the idea of getting rid of me. What was the hold up? If my two best friends were going to drift away, I didn't want to be stuck watching it. That's all I set out to do. Talk to Ned.

SOUND: WILL HEADS DOWN THE HALLWAY.

DORI (WITHIN)

——doesn't make any sense! You can't keep lying to me!

SOUND: WILL FREEZES.

NED (WITHIN)

Now, Dori, I think you're misinterpreting where I'm coming from. I only care about what's best for you.

FADE TO: INT. - NED'S OFFICE

DORI

I did everything you ever asked. I'm asking for one thing.

NED

But why? If you believe so strongly that he's worthy, what does a few weeks change? You'll see him again.

DORI

But things will be different.

NED

Which matters more to you? What you've been working toward your whole life, or an ordinary boy you met a few months ago?

DORI

It's not just him. Ruth, too, she's really important to me.

NED

She'll be joining us before long. You'll still see her as much as you want —— within reason, while she adjusts.

DOR

But you can't just give me something and——

NED

——It's not just that the village needs you. You need to come back to the village. We've allowed you to... drift up to a certain point, but these last weeks are crucial. Once, I would never have

even *dreamed* I'd have to lecture you. Now it's all I can do to keep you in check. Why is that?

DORI

...Fine. I'll go to Harriet. But I won't give in on school.

SOUND: DORI OPENS THE DOOR TO LEAVE. SHE GASPS. WILL RECOILS.

DORI

Will! You nearly gave me a heart attack. What are you doing?

WILL

L-Looking for the bathroom. Are you finished with your...?

DORI

Actually, I have to head out, too.

WILL

Where?

DORI

Just some routine counselling. But, um... When I get back... Can we talk, maybe? It's important.

WILL

'Course.

NED (WITHIN)

Dorian. Evelyn's waiting outside.

DORI

Later, then.

SOUND: DORI GOES.

NED (WITHIN)

How much did you hear, Will?

WILL

Nothing, sir. Just passing by.

NED (WITHIN)

Carry on, then. I'll see about arranging that car for you.

SCENE 9

(INT. - WILL'S ROOM, EVENING. HE SITS. AND SITS.)

WILL (NARRATING)

I didn't touch my books after that. The hours just... passed. One minute, I looked up, and the sun was long gone. Was Dorian, still? What did she want to talk about? Would she explain what I had overheard? Would I tell her I'd heard it? What was it that she needed to do? Was she safe? Were any of us?

SOUND: A KNOCK ON THE DOOR. WILL STARTLES.

WILL

Who is it?

RUTH (OFF)

Me. Can you let me in? I've got some kind of squash soup thing from a kitchen guy named Gabe. Smells great. (BEAT.) Will?

SOUND: WILL STRIDES OVER, USHERS HER IN, AND SHUTS THE DOOR.

WILL

Something bad is going on with Dori.

RUTH

What? Is she okay? Oh my god, wait, is this your room——?

WILL

——Who cares, Ruth? Listen. She's lying to us about something. I heard her and Ned talking. There's some big day or event coming up in the village, and he's putting pressure on her, but somehow we come into it, too? It doesn't even make sense until I say it out loud, but I think Ned sees us —— me —— as a threat. Since I won't join in, like... like you.

(BEAT.)

RUTH

They were talking about us?

WILL

Dori was arguing *for* us, but it sounded like Ned was trying to create distance. He might have even been talking about pulling her out of school.

RUTH

No, that doesn't make sense. Paulette said Ned wanted to *use* Dorian's "new education" or whatever.

WILL

I don't trust them. Dori will argue with them to their face, but then defend them to us when we ask.

(GROANS IN REALIZATION)

A few days ago, I walked in on her and her Mom talking about a ceremony, and she completely distracted me, I didn't even——

RUTH

——Will. You know I'm always on your side, but let's talk this through rationally. Closed religions exist.

WILL

They're letting you in!

RUTH

Okay, maybe not "closed" closed, but you know what I mean! And nobody's said anything concrete on that. Anyway, maybe whatever they're doing isn't shared with outsiders.

WILL

Ned said that. He called me an "outsider." You don't think that's a weird word?

RUTH

I'm pretty sure *you* called me an outsider when I first moved to Silver Falls. A lot of places keep tight-knit. Did they say anything dangerous or scary?

I... I don't remember for sure. It was —— It was the tone. God, my heart was beating so fast——

RUTH

——Hey. Sit down.

SOUND: WILL SITS, AND RUTH BESIDE HIM.

WILL

Do you *really* think there's nothing weird about this place? Fences popping up out of nowhere and Dorian always getting yanked away... If you'd heard it, you'd believe me. I don't think Dorian can see he's being manipulated, and he won't let us in enough to hear it from us.

RUTH

You're jumping to a pretty major conclusion based on one conversation you weren't even supposed to hear.

WILL

Ruth, I know you want to make this work, but you just said it! They're keeping major secrets! You need to be careful. Anybody who can give out something this huge, no strings attached, can take it away just as easily.

RUTH

Why do you think I gotta make a good impression?

WILL

I don't *know*. Make sure you can trust them. Don't let them hold it over you. You deserve to belong regardless.

RUTH

...You think so?

WILL

Always have.

RUTH

(HALF-JOKING)

Careful. Don't let Dori hear you say that.

WILL

Did you see if he was back? *That* he definitely lied about. He said he was going to meet "Harriet" but then he told me he was going for counselling.

RUTH

Will, Harriet's a counsellor. She runs the meditation, remember? You need to relax, eat, and then we'll, I don't know, go for a walk? Wait for Dori to get back together.

WILL

I was thinking of leaving.

RUTH

What?

WILL

Ned was going to find someone to drive me home. I don't know if I can now. Something's *wrong*.

RUTH

Come on.

SOUND: SHE FETCHES THEIR BOWLS.

RUTH (CONT'D)

You need to be a human for a second. Get out of your brain. Food. No talking. Stay right here with me.

SOUND: WILL TAKES A SPOONFUL. THEY EAT FOR A MOMENT.

WILL

Does it feel like we abandoned you?

RUTH

Will...

WILL

I don't think I'm supposed to feel guilty. But I do.

WILL You know what I'm talking about.
RUTH
Yeah, well. We can't talk about it.
WILL Why not?
RUTH Because what kind of a friend would I be if I put <i>my</i> loneliness on you. You deserve to be in a relationship that makes you happy. Both of you do.
WILL You make me happy, too. You're my best friend.
RUTH Will, please dont.
WILL And he likes you so much, too. I keep thinking back to when I first found out you were home, and Dorian kept saying we just needed to talk, to both of us, but we wouldn't listen —— but then, the second we did, we worked everything out.
RUTH And now we're here, and I am extremely grateful. But I need to work <i>this</i> out alone.
WILL Ruth, you're not——
RUTH ——You're spiraling. Don't spill every thought in your head. Eat. Then let's get out of this depressing room.

RUTH

You're not making any sense.

SCENE 10

(INT. - THE BLACK ROOM, A SENSORY DEPRIVATION CHAMBER.)

SOUND: A DOOR OPENS.

HARRIET

Dori? You can come out now.

SOUND: DORI STUMBLES INTO THE HALL.

DORI

What, uh...? What time...?

HARRIET

You've been inside for six hours. Do you feel centered?

DORI

I feel... better.

HARRIET

Good. Disconnect to reconnect.

DORI

Yes. Yes, it was a hard disconnect. But I feel good now.

HARRIET

Your sister is here to walk you home.

SCENE 11

(INT. - RUTH'S ROOM, LATE EVENING. RUTH GETS READY FOR BED WHILE WILL PACES.)

WILL

Do you think he'll be back at all tonight?

RUTH

(YAWNS.)

I don't know. Please sit before you carve a line in the floor.

SOUND: A LAMP CLICKS OFF. RUTH GETS UNDER THE COVERS. WILL STOPS PACING, SITS IN A CHAIR.

WILL

Thank you for letting me stay. Sorry I said all that before.

RUTH

Don't worry. I wouldn't leave you alone. (BEAT.) Or Dorian.

SOUND: FOOTSTEPS IN THE HALLWAY, SOFT. A NEARBY DOOR OPENS.

WILL (CONT'D)

Is that——?

RUTH

——Go on.

SOUND: WILL HURRIES INTO THE HALL.

DORI

Oh. Hey. Is Ruth still up?

RUTH

(FROM BED)

No. Unless you need me. But no.

WILL

I was waiting for you. Can I come in?

DORI

(HESITATES)

I don't know if that's a good idea. I think there are still... you know... people around.

WILL

It's after midnight.

DORI

Ned's people tend to work late hours.

(FRC	RUTH DM BED)
He's been freaking out.	•
Alright, come in.	DORI
SOUND: V ROOM.	VILL AND DORI ENTER DORI'S
I'm sorry I was gone so lo training me right away.	DORI (CONT'D) ng. I wasn't expecting Ned to start
I thought you were at cour	WILL nselling.
(BEAT.)	
UhYeah.	DORI
Dori. Please don't lie to mo	WILL e.
Well. If I tell you the truth, me?	DORI will you promise you won't try to help
Dori, what the hell is going	WILL g on?
If I told you something tha that scared you, would yo	DORI t you couldn't believe, or something u try to help me?
O-Of course I would——	WILL
——Then I can't tell you.	DORI

WILL

I really need to talk to you. You were gone all day.

WILL

What?

DORI

I may be upset with my church over some small things, but nothing can push me away from what I owe them.

WILL

Fine. I won't press if you tell me one thing: are you safe?

DORI

...You need to get better at arguing. Are you staying?

WILL

I thought you wanted to follow the rules.

DORI

Sometimes I want you more.

SOUND: DORI CLIMBS INTO BED. THEN, AFTER A MOMENT, WILL. THEY SETTLE.

WILL

(laughs) somewhere a page in a sketchbook is burning.

DORI

(laughs) yea maybe.

DORI (CONT'D)

Are you angry?

WILL

I'm scared. For you.

DORI

I promise you'll understand soon. Everything will be okay.

SOUND: WILL SLIDES HIS HAND OVER THE SHEETS. DORI TAKES IT.

WILL (NARRATING)

Her fingers grazed over the inside of my palm before her hand settled into mine. I realized one thing because of the other: I am

a gravedigger inhabited by death, and Dori makes me feel alive. Did trust even factor into it?

Once she fell asleep, I was alone again, alone still, with all these thoughts I couldn't hold. With her hand given to me. And too much doubt. I knew that I should have tried resting, but I stared at her cheekbones in what little light there was and held my breath for the sake of hearing hers.

Then, for one more night, I slept.

SCENE 12

(INT. - THE BEDROOM, NEXT MORNING, WITH BOTH WILL AND DORIAN STILL IN BED.)

SOUND: DORIAN AND WILL ASLEEP. THEN —— KNOCK, KNOCK.

WILL

...Does that mean we have to get up?

DORIAN

(A TELLING BEAT) I'm good here.

SOUND: WILL SNICKERS. SOME TENSION FROM LAST NIGHT IS GONE.

DORIAN

Hi.

WILL

Hi.

(BEAT.)

I have a new question. What if I still wanted to help you, even if I didn't know what was going on?

DORIAN

How would you do that?

WILL

I think I just wouldn't let you stop me.

DORIAN

It wouldn't be *just* me trying to stop you.

SOUND: ANOTHER KNOCK ON THE DOOR.

RUTH (OFF)

Everybody decent?

DORIAN

Ugh, Ruth, yes. Get in here.

SOUND: THE DOOR SWINGS OPEN.

RUTH

'Sup. How are the conspiracies panning out?

WILL

I'm still trying to figure out if we can even joke about it. He's not being helpful.

DORIAN

(SIGHS) Ruth, come join us. I need to cuddle.

RUTH

(STAMMERS) You have a *boyfriend* for that.

DORIAN

Well, maybe I want you both.

WILL

(SMILING)

You are so spoiled.

RUTH

For real?

DORIAN

Mhmm.

SOUND: SHE ENTERS FULLY. THE BED SHIFTS. THEY ALL SETTLE.

DORIAN (CONT'D)

Doesn't this feel right when we're all together? No misunderstandings, no one in our way——

SOUND: DORIAN'S RADIO RINGS ACROSS THE ROOM.

DORIAN (CONT'D)

(GROANS LOUDLY. SIGHS.)

That must be my Mama. Be right back.

SOUND: HE GOES AND ANSWERS IT. RUTH AND WILL CONFER QUIETLY.

RUTH

So?

WILL

Something is up. But he seems okay. I only wish he would talk to me.

RUTH

Sorry if it seemed like I was brushing you off last night. I do really want this place to be all he says it is.

DORIAN (OFF)

Alright, we'll go soon.

(Beat)

Alright, now.

(Beat)

Okay, love you, bye.

SOUND: DORIAN RETURNS.

DORIAN (CONT'D)

Okay! Who's up for a Sunday morning errand?

SCENE 13

(EXT. - DIRT ROAD, MORNING. DORIAN, WILL, AND RUTH ARE WALKING ALL. THE WAY. TO. THE RANCH HOUSE.)

SOUND: EXHAUSTED, TRUDGING FOOTSTEPS. RUTH CARRIES A BASKET OF BEANS.

WILL

Regretting not bringing your car yet?

RUTH

(CRUNCH)

Worried that my legs will get more jacked than yours?

DORI

Stop eating our beans. Mama will have a fit.

RUTH

I'm gonna tell them you did it. I'm everyone's favorite this weekend.

WILL

To be fair, at this rate, the basket will be half-empty before we even hit the forest.

RUTH

It's not *my* fault someone dragged us out of Ned's before we got to enjoy a nice breakfast!

DORI

Hey, can we take a shortcut?

RUTH

Is there a shortcut?

DORI

We should be able to cut through the old strawberry fields, and that'll get us back to the road without having to go all the way around.

SOUND: AS ONE, THEY STEP OFF THE PATH.

WILL

There you go. Eat some strawberries.

RUTH

Not out of season?

DORI

You will if you value the opportunity to try my Mama's bean salad.

SOUND: RUTH AND WILL BUST OUT LAUGHING.

RUTH

I'm sorry! I want bean salad!

SOUND: A CAR DOOR SLAMS.

EVELYN (OFF)

Hey! Get back from there!

SOUND: EVERYONE FREEZES, STARTLED.

RUTH

Is that Evelyn?

WILL

Who?

RUTH

She's like Maxine. They work together.

DORI And you met the nice one. **RUTH** (LOWLY) Come on, let's not piss anyone off. SOUND: THEY WALK OVER TO EVELYN. **EVELYN** Oh, it's you three. Dorian, I'd expect you to know better. DORI What? It's a field. WILL Hang on. There's a building over there. See? Bottom of the hill. **EVELYN** This section of the village is abandoned. It's dangerous. Certainly, no place for outsiders. WILL Huh. What was——? **EVELYN** (FIRMLY) ——Just trying to look out for you. SOUND: SHE GETS BACK INTO HER CAR AND DRIVES OFF. WILL Dori? Do you know what's down there?

DORI

All I know is what she said. If we shouldn't get close, I'm sure it's for good reason.

WILL

You believe her that easily?

DORI

What do you want me to say?

(BEAT.)

RUTH

So... no shortcut?

SCENE 14

(INT. - RANCH HOUSE, AFTERNOON. DORI, WILL, AND RUTH ENTER. IN THE OTHER ROOM, A CONVERSATION.)

PAULETTE (WITHIN)

As long as it will work this soon, I don't see why not. If we need more time, either way, he isn't going back to——

DORIAN (WITHIN) (POINTEDLY) ——

We're home!

WILL (NARRATING)

It was easy to find more shapeless clues once we reached the ranch house. Of the pictures on the wall, Dori's were biggest, but far fewer in number than Margaret and Lily's. What made her, in a family that preached love and unity, so unconsciously othered?

SOUND: NED AND PAULETTE ENTER.

NED

(TO WILL)

So you are here. I was starting to think you'd fled in the night.

WILL

S-Sorry?

NED

Someone came by your room this morning, about six, ready to get you loaded up and on your way home —— like you asked — only, you weren't *in* your room. Fond of early morning walks?

WILL

RUTH

——That's my fault. I woke up with bad cramps. Will's always helped me through them, since we were kids. He was in my room.

PAULETTE

Well, that's a relief. Now, the table is set and the girls are hungry. We should all——

WILL

----Excuse me. I don't feel very well.

SOUND: A STUNNED BEAT. THEN, WILL FLEES OUTSIDE.

SCENE 15

(EXT. - THE PORCH, MOMENTS LATER. WILL LEANS ON THE BANNISTER, BREATHING SHAKILY.)

SOUND: A STRETCH OF ALMOST UNBEARABLE AMBIENCE. THEN, THE DOOR OPENS.

DORIAN

I can leave if you want to be alone, but... figured you might be hungry.

SOUND: DORIAN HANDS WILL A PLATE.

WILL

Thank you. Sorry. Couldn't be in there. Ned was looking at me like he *knew*, and...

DORIAN

Don't apologize. I wanted to check on you earlier, but, well, I was told it might not be a good idea.



Your mom doesn't like me either, does she?

DORIAN

Of course she does! She likes everybody.

WILL

(DOUBTFUL) Sure.

DORIAN

You're still worrying after yesterday, aren't you?

WILL

What did you want to talk to me about before you left?

DORIAN

I... It's nothing. I got ahead of myself.

WILL

The thing that freaks me out most is why you refuse to tell me.

DORIAN

What, you tell me everything? Sometimes you get all weird and clam up for no reason and I never know why, but I don't automatically jump to the worst conclusion and force you to explain yourself!

WILL

That's because I buried corpses. Since I was eight.

(BEAT.)

DORIAN (STRICKEN)

What?

WILL

I don't talk about it because... I don't want people to know. It's just... Its just something I can't talk about.

DORIAN

H-Hang on.... I need to think for a sec.

WILL

(HUFFS)

See? No going back. Dori, I've never felt this way about anyone before. I'm sorry I didn't tell you and I'm sorry I won't ever be like you.

DORIAN

(STARTS TO PANIC)

But you —— if you —— what about life after death! Doesn't that help? That makes you feel better, right?

WILL

No. I don't believe in it.

DORIAN

Of course you do! There's life after death, Will!

WILL

Whoa! I wasn't trying to argue your faith! But... no.

DORIAN

WILL

(RHETORICAL)

What, are you planning on dying any time soon?

SOUND: MOVEMENT FROM INSIDE, THE SCRAPES OF CHAIRS.

DORIAN

(DOGGED)

They're just clearing up. Will, something's about to happen.

WILL

I know. Involving you.

DORIAN

Y-Yes. I swear, I would have done things differently if I'd known.

WILL

What	is	it?	

DORIAN

I didn't think I'd ever have to explain it. I can't —— I don't know what to——

WILL

----Dorian, breathe. Slowly. What is going on?

SOUND: DORIAN HYPERVENTILATES.

WILL (CONT'D)

Hey. Calm down.

DORIAN

I'm sorry. It's my fault. I thought you'd be excited...

WILL

You're scaring me, Dorian. Can I get — who should I get?

DORIAN

N-no. No one. I don't know what they'll...

SOUND: DORIAN FAINTS.

WILL

Dorian? Dorian! HELP!

SOUND: HASTE FROM INSIDE ——
FOOTSTEPS, POUNDING TOWARD US.
EVERYONE SPILLS OUT THE DOOR,
RUTH FIRST.

RUTH

Oh my God, what happened?

WILL

He passed out!

PAULETTE

Yuri, bring him inside.

SOUND: YURI PICKS UP DORIAN AND CARRIES HIM INTO THE HOUSE.

NED

I'm sure he's alright, Paulette. Go with him, your family needs you. I'll come in in a minute to help out.

SOUND: SHE RETREATS. THE SCREEN DOOR SLAPS SHUT.

RUTH (TO WILL)

You okay?

NED

Thank you, Will, for your diligent raising of an alarm, but for the health of my parishioner, I think it's well past time you left the village. I'll radio for a car.

SOUND: NED HEADS ONTO THE GRASS AND MAKES A CALL. (SEE WALLA DOC.)

WILL

He can't be serious. He's only saying it's my fault to push me out!

RUTH

Will, he's mad, and he's the leader-

WILL

——Come on! It's an act! Everything that happens here is an act!

RUTH

I could —— I could bring you home.

WILL

No, we can't leave Dori. I'm not going. She was just about to tell me...

SOUND: NED HANGS UP AND RETURNS.

NED

Everything alright over here?

RUTH

(TO WILL)

Take my car. We'll get a ride back.

NED

Will, I apologize, but I do insist. Be sensible. Take Ruth's offer and collect your things. If you don't go willingly, you'll be removed.

WILL

I'll go if Dorian tells me he's fine. Convincingly.

RUTH

I'll make sure Dorian's okay. We probably won't be able to leave right when he wakes up, so we'll stay the night and follow you in the morning.

(BEAT.)

WILL

Okay. Will you tell him something at least?

RUTH

Of course.

WILL

Just... make sure he hears the old advice.

RUTH

...Okay. I'll radio you when he's awake. My keys are on the desk in my room.

SOUND: RUTH HEADS BACK INTO THE HOUSE. A CAR PULLS UP.

NFD

Evelyn will escort you back to my house.

WILL

That was... fast.

NED

Word to the wise —— always keep someone you trust nearby. Once you have all your belongings, take the road down to the gate. Give the word "Harvest" to the lookout and you'll be let through.

SCENE 16

(INT. - THE BASEMENT, A SMALL, BARE UNDERGROUND ROOM. RAGGED PRISONERS, INCLUDING CARLOS, SIT CONFINED TO METAL CHAIRS. THESE ARE ALL "THE NON-BELIEVERS."

EVELYN

Alright... Sandra. Hell of a spin you caused today. Time for confession. How's it feel to be back in that chair?

SOUND: SANDRA WHIMPERS.

EVELYN (CONT'D)

What, did you think someone in the village would help you? Or you'd make it out of the woods on foot? (LAUGHS.) I'll bet that fence was a nasty shock. (SERIOUS)
Where were you going? Who did you want to alert?

SANDRA

I'm sorry...

CARLOS

(LOW)

Don't...

EVELYN

What was that, Carlos?

CARLOS

(TO SANDRA)

They'll never believe you... Just don't.

SOUND: EVELYN UNDOES A PAIR OF LEATHER STRAPS ON CARLOS'S WRISTS.

EVELYN

Tell you what, pal. Get up. Go ahead. I'm gonna make you an offer. Make *one* person confess... and you'll sleep on a mattress tonight.

SOUND: CARLOS STANDS SHAKILY.

EVELYN (CONT'D)

There. Stretch those legs. Feels good, hm? Don't hold out on us. Show us what blessed stuff this great prophet is made of! Come on! They can't fight back! I'll show you!

SOUND: SHE SOCKS A NONBELIEVER IN THE GUT.

CARLOS

Stop it!

EVELYN

Why? You ready to try?

CARLOS

I won't hurt anyone. I won't turn on these people like the church turned on us.

SOUND: THE BASEMENT DOOR SLAMS OPEN. MAXINE PUSHES IN WILL

MAXINE

Evelyn? What's going on?

EVELYN

Ned's orders. We're offering a chance for redemption. Until them all.

MAXINE

Wasn't this one under Dorian's protection?

EVELYN

He was.

WII I

What is this place? Who are all of you?

CARLOS

Everyone stay calm!

EVELYN (MOCKING)

Everyone stay calm! This might be your only chance to earn back your place in the village! Show us you want it!

SOUND: THE NON-BELIEVERS
SLUGGISHLY CONVERGE ON WILL. HE
TAKES SEVERAL BLOWS.

WILL

What's happening?!

CARLOS

You don't have to do this! Don't do this!

SOUND: CARLOS WRANGLES A NONBELIEVER OFF WILL.

MAXINE

Get off him! Everyone off!

SOUND: THE NON-BELIEVERS
SCRAMBLE AWAY, EXCEPT CARLOS.
WILL GROANS.

CARLOS

It's okay. You're alright.

MAXINE

It's Will, yes? I apologize, but you've been brought to the wrong place. I learned something interesting about you from that Silver Falls girl. Apparently, you are both adept diggers. Now it so happens that, very soon, we'll be in need of a fresh grave.

[MUSIC]
