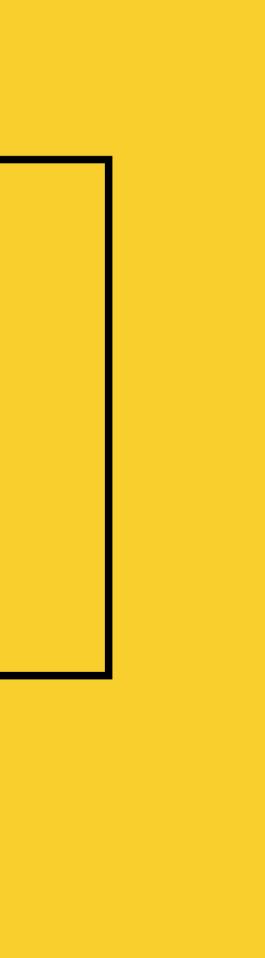
Shield






PAINTS USED IN THIS GUIDE

Reaper: Rust Brown AK: Deep Yellow







The shield was sketched using Reaper Rust Brown, imagining a light coming from above, therefore highlighting most of the shield, except the areas facing downward.


PART 1



I added a bit of AK Deep Yellow to the Rust Brown to create a warm yellow-orange. This color was usefull in creating a more warm feeling in the golds of the shield vs the "colder" feeling golds of the non-orangelit areas.

I placed the color on all the up facing areas of the shield that were meant to be gold, leaving a bit of the Rust Brown basecoat in a few areas, to create contrast.


OSL PART 2



I added a touch of white to the previous mix and used it to edge highlight and paint some small highlights on the volumes (most notably the forehead of the skull). Once happy with the sketch I blended the colors together using in-between mixes of the layers present and simply basecoated them on the separation between the layers.

I basecoated the shield in a dark orange mixing Rust Brown and black.

OSL PART 3



I then re added Rust Brown to the basecoat mix, creating a more desaturated orange thanks to the black in the basecoating mix and used it to highlight the upper part of the shield as well a small part of the lower part.

I then added a touch of white and used it to paint the edges.

OSL PART 4
